ESTA's Midwest Rigging Intensive returns with a focus on touring rigging

ESTA's MIDWEST RIGGING INTENSIVE (MRI) will make its exciting return August 14–16, 2025 and will offer riggers across the industry an outstanding opportunity to build skills, earn ETCP continuing education credits, and connect with like-minded professionals. Hosted this year at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, MRI 2025 will deliver a unique training occasion with a specialized focus: Touring Rigging.

In 2022, the focus was on theatre rigging and in 2023, the focus was on arena rigging. This year offers elements of both rigging styles as a comprehensive approach to touring rigging. This intensive two-and-a-halfday event goes beyond lecture presentations to provide practical, hands-on training tailored to the challenges of touring productions. Whether navigating large arenas, traditional theatrical fly systems, or adapting to unconventional venues, riggers will leave MRI with insights that apply directly to the job. With sessions including: "Order of Operations for Tour Planning," "Challenging Venues," "Special Considerations," "Dealing with Heavy Components," and troubleshooting exercises, the curriculum reflects the evolving complexity of modern touring shows.

What sets MRI apart is not only its hands-on instruction but the instructors themselves. An impressive roster of ETCP Recognized Trainers—who are experts in entertainment rigging—collaborate to deliver training that is current, relevant, and based on real-life rigging situations. Attendees will learn more than one way to approach challenges when rigging a tour.
